6 MATTERS ARISING

PHONE BOX

The clerk confirmed that she had forwarded a link to the BT website to the Young Farmers for them to purchase the phone box outside the Cruwys Arms.

10 SPEED LIMIT SIGNS – Pennymoor

The clerk stated that she received 15 replies to the survey about having 20mph is plenty signs through the village of Pennymoor with 13 of those thinking the signs would be a good idea.

Since the survey the clerk has spoken to the SteveTucker at Devon CC highways who suggested that the policy on having 30mph signs had changed and that Pennymoor may now fit the criteria and thought it would be a good idea to make the request to the Highways Department.

11 **DEFIBRILLATOR**

Suggestions were made about siting it someone around the Cruwys Arms i.e front porch or back outbuilding and the clerk was asked to speak to Mr & Mrs Randerson the landlords of the pub.

12 HIGHWAY PROBLEMS

The clerk stated that there had been a recent site meeting at Tollgate with Steve Tucker, Cllr Squires and Gavin Hall. The outcome was that Highways would add the road repair at Pages Cross junction and at Tollgate junction including the collapsed drain and the potholes right upto Two Post Cross.
