Notes of previous meetings

The Action Points from the previous Meeting on the 21st of July were agreed. In Matters Arising Graeme referred to the work of Jock on the Stakeholder Contact Strategy, Mark on the Provisional Budget, and Dave on the Milestones Schedule of the Plan. These were shared with all Members before the Meeting. It was requested that any updates or additions to these documents be added through contacting the publisher of the document. Community Forum-content and organisation.

Actions

The importance and relevance of the existing "settlement" and "conservation areas" in the village. Plus, the history of previous planning proposals. The different types of social housing.
