HOSPISCARE UPDATE:

As an independent local charity, Hospiscare has been supporting people in Devon living with terminal illnesses for over 40 years. We've expanded our area over that time and now cover over 1,000 square miles of our county including Exeter and Central and East Devon. We have expert doctors and nurses to help if anyone has been diagnosed with a life-limiting illness. Our services include support at home, a specialist palliative care ward, outpatients clinics, and supportive therapies. We support over 2,000 people each year, in some of the hardest times possible, with just 15% of our funding coming from the government, compared to the national average of 27% for hospices. Therefore Hospiscare has been facing a £2.5 million funding gap and has had to reduce some of its vital services. Without the hospice, its patients will be treated in an acute hospital setting where they will be a further demand on the NHS system. The hospice costs almost £10 million a year to run and we have to raise over 80% through charitable fundraising every year. Therefore we ask for any support either through our fundraising events or volunteering in our local charity shops.
