Scattering grit on the pre-agreed areas	Moving heavy loads of grit.	Back damage	Moderate	 Only move small quantities of grit at a time. Use a wheelbarrow to move the grit any distance.

Moderate-severe	 Do not work after dark or in other situations of limited visibility. Wear a high vis vest. Volunteers do not work on the A377 or Station Road.
