	Encounters with motorists/pedestrians	Irate motorists, vehicles stuck in flood water. Collision between volunteer and vehicle	Moderate – severe	<ul> <li>Avoid discussions with members of the public. It is their decision to risk going through a flood.</li> <li>Wear high vis jackets to indicate you are a flood warden.</li> <li>Do not work on A377.</li> </ul>

				<ul> <li>Do not attempt to move a vehicle stuck in flood water.</li> <li>Do not go into flood water to rescue someone. Call the emergency services. If two flood wardens are present. You may use the grab ropes to assist a rescue, but only if the trapped person is capable of using the grab rope.</li> </ul>
	Moving heavy road signs	Damage to back	Moderate	Lift the heavy road signs using bent knees and straight back.
Alleviating flooding by clearing grains/gullies.	Deep water and moving heavy objects	Risk of Drowning  Coming across hidden objects underwater and sustaining injury from these.  Damage to back	Moderate – severe	<ul> <li>Do not go into deep water.</li> <li>If you can attempt to alleviate a blockage, discuss the plan with the coordinator before attempting the task and keep in contact using WhatsApp. If possible, do not work alone.</li> <li>Wear suitable waterproof clothing and use appropriate equipment.</li> <li>If in doubt, do not attempt to clear the blockage</li> </ul>
	Contaminated water	Risk of infection	Moderate - severe	<ul> <li>On returning home, take a shower, taking particular care over cuts.</li> <li>If you start to feel unwell, consult a doctor immediately.</li> </ul>

Supervising evacuation of residents should extreme flooding occur.	Encounters with residents.	Arguments with residents, being asked to move heavy objects.	Low	<ul> <li>If evacuation of homes is deemed necessary, you can inform residents but it is up to them to comply.</li> <li>Do not move heavy objects at the request of a resident.</li> <li>Follow the rules in the evacuation centres for monitoring residents and providing support.</li> </ul>
Preventative work to minimise risk of flooding, inspection of Shuttern Brook	Deep water  Moving heavy objects	Drowning, encountering submerged objects  Damage to back.	Moderate to severe	<ul> <li>Only work on water courses when water levels are low. Do not go into deep water.</li> <li>Do not work alone.</li> <li>Use appropriate equipment for the task.</li> <li>Most repair/remedial work should be carried out by the landowner, not by the flood network.</li> </ul>
