⚠ Please note: Items coated with Teflon (non-stick) will *not* be accepted in this collection. These should instead be taken to your local recycling centre.

m National and Local Policy Updates

Despite recent ministerial changes, the government remains committed to delivering 1.5 million new homes.

Locally, the planned timeline for the Local Government Reorganisation (England) (LGR) remains unchanged. Authorities in Devon are currently exploring a number of potential new structural models, including:

- 1. A "451/145" model (supported by 8 out of 11 councils, including Mid Devon)
- 2. A proposal to expand Plymouth's unitary status
- 3. A unitary proposal for Exeter
- 4. Creation of a single Devon-wide council (excluding Plymouth and possibly Torbay)
