Meeting with DCC PROW managers 2nd October 2025-summary of main points

Repairs to Footpath "Furniture" and infrastructure

Depending on circumstances, this might be the landowner, the P3 partner or DCC (using a local contractor via a Framework).

Gates and Stiles. DCC have a policy of not authorising new or replacement stiles; however a landowner can continue to maintain a stile if pre-existing/lawful and needed for livestock management. Gaps or Gates are much preferred as these are easier to maintain and provide much better access to paths for people with a range of ages and abilities. DCC view the installation of new gates to replace inadequate stiles as an improvement and will consider P3 applications to grant fund.

Repairs to gates and stiles are usually the responsibility of the Landowner. However Landowners can potentially reclaim part of the cost of repairing damaged footpath "furniture" (e.g. gates) from DCC. At a practicable level, the landowner may be provided with the materials or DCC may instruct a contractor.

DCC may consider a P3 grant bid for improvement to existing stiles (e.g. an additional bottom step) if the landowner will not agree to a gap or gate and the stiles are otherwise in good repair.

Reporting of faults should be via the online system (ref. Report a problem with a public right
of way - Roads and transport)

If helpful, P3 groups can choose to use the same local contractors as available to DCC via the framework agreement. Details will be shared (action for Richard / Debbie).

Bridges. Bridges across /part of public rights of way are inspected by DCC either by a public rights of way warden or an engineer from the bridges and structures team. For smaller bridges (less than 6 metres span) there is a 3 yearly cycle of checks by DCC wardens. Depending on the structure, larger (more than 6 metres span) bridges are subject to a general inspection every couple of years, and a more detailed principle inspection on a 6 to 18 year cycle. Damage to bridges should be reported ASAP via the details at Report a problem with a public right of way - Roads and transport.

Mud and drainage

Serious mud that requires drainage improvement work should be reported to DCC via Report a problem with a public right of way - Roads and transport. Where ownership details are known, the P3 reps may want to engage first with the landowner about the problem.

Lesser mud problems, that might be fixed quite easily, can also be discussed and potentially resolved with the landowner. When reported, DCC will inspect and assess the situation and the work required. Surface improvements may be suitable for a P3 grant.

DCC PROW Contractors

DCC has a "framework agreement" with approx. 50 approved contractors across Devon that can carry our repairs and improvement works usually on a agreed hourly rate. Locally James Ayre is one such.

This agreement has three categories of provider:-

- 1. Basic maintenance and repair work including strimming, basic chainsaw work involving up to two workpeople.
- 2. Work requiring a work gang and/or machinery, including drainage and resurfacing work.
- 3. Work requiring special technical advice

Upgrowth and Strimming

The clearing of upgrowth and strimming is predominantly done by DCC contractors, with paper maps based on historical need but updated when known changes are required (e.g., a previously grazed field no longer subject to grazing). P3 Parishes can and do report work that needs doing, although it may be the case that cuts will have been planned but the contractor has not yet got to that particular path yet. P3 Parishes can enter into agreement to organise cutting direct e.g., using volunteers or a local contact, or make direct contact with approved contractors to commission work at DCC agreed prices using their own budget or by bidding for P3 Grant money.

Reporting of overgrown paths (not maintained by the P3 Parish) should be reported via Report a problem with a public right of way - Roads and transport

New PROWS and diverting existing PROWS

Consideration to add a new PROW if there is historic evidence, or established, uninterrupted public use over a 20 year period requires an application under schedule 14 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. DCC has also been relatively proactive by carrying out a parish-by-parish review in liaison with respective parish and town councils, and identifying suitable paths. If a landowner of a proposed new PROW is in agreement, the process for designation may be easier and more likely to be successful. If a landowner is willing, public rights can also be created by agreement (creation / dedication). The process is more complex, and likelihood of success lower, if the landowner is not in agreement.

Path changes such as diversion and extinguishment can also be made under the Highways Act 1980 (and Town and Country Plannin Act 1990 if required as part of an approved development). Again, these are more likely to be successful if the landowner agrees.

There is a waiting list for Definitive Map changes of this sort but suggestions on potential new paths (such as missing links) are welcome.
